**Subject: Death notice of Fr. Anđelko Badurina, T.O.R.
Province of St. Jerome, Croatia**

We have received word that our friend and brother,



FR. ANĐELKO BADURINA, T.O.R.

Fr. Anđelko Badurina, member of the Province of St. Jerome, Croatia died on 14th December 2013 in St. Francis Friary, Odra, Zagreb.

Fr. Anđelko was born on 2nd October 1935 in Lun, on Pag Island, he was the son of Mate and Manda, born Škunca. He was christened on 1st December 1935. He was admitted to the Minor Seminary of the Province in 1947, in Zagreb; he professed his temporary vows in 1952 in Krk and his solemn vows in 1958 in St. Francis Xavier Friary in Zagreb. He attended the secondary school (classical studies) in Zagreb and in Split and took his diploma



in 1955. Fr. Anđelko completed his theological studies at the Faculty of Theology in Zagreb in 1963. He showed a great interest in the Glagolitic cultural heritage and completed his archive-keeping and Glagolitic and Cyrillic Paleography courses.

He was ordained to the priesthood in 1961 in Zagreb. After a period of stay in Krk he attended his History of Art Studies at the Faculty of Philosophy in Zagreb where he obtained a degree in 1975. Fr. Anđelko was on the staff of the Institute of Art History in Zagreb from 1969 to 2000.

In the Province he served as provincial secretary, vicar, provincial councilor, local minister, teacher in the Grammar School of the Province, local supply officer and other offices. He spent the longest period of his life in Odra from 1972 to his death. He very often used to help the surrounding parishes in their pastoral activities.

Requiem Mass was celebrated by Msgr. Valentin Pozaić, auxiliary bishop of Zagreb as principal celebrant and was concelebrated by thirty friars of the Province and several diocesan priests of the area.

Fr. Nikola Barun, Provincial Minister, doctor Milan Pelc, director of the Institute of Art History, Mr. Ante Dabo, Mayor of Novalja (Lun) and Fr. Ilija Živković, local minister in Odra, delivered a eulogy on Fr. Anđelko's life, personality and offices.

The funeral service in the Cemetery of Odra was officiated by the Provincial Minister. It was participated by a multitude of faithful, lots of people who collaborated in Fr. Anđelko's scientific work, and a large number of inhabitants of Odra town and its surroundings where Fr. Anđelko lived for more than forty years.

May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.
